Starting in February 2018, the *Messenger* will no longer be sent to members and friends using bulk mailing. There will be four options available for continuing to receive the newsletter:

- pick up a print edition in church
- have a copy emailed to you
- read the edited version posted on the First Church website ([firstchurchmonson.org](http://firstchurchmonson.org))
- subscribe to receive a copy sent via first class mail (\$12.00/year)

The mail reason for this change is our declining membership numbers. In order to send items by bulk mail, there must be at least 200 identical pieces. With the recent membership review conducted as per our by-laws, we fall well below that number.

The Stewardship team and Church Council are working hard on the 2018 budget. We are expecting our total pledges for 2018 to be close to \$110,000, so we will continue to receive pledge commitments into the middle of January.

## *Treasurer's Treehouse*

The Treasurer's Treehouse is dedicated to informing the congregation of the First Church of Monson about the Church's financial condition in a lighthearted yet clear-cut manner.

Last month I discussed our income and how the church is responsible for managing our income and expenses through various funds. This month I would like to go into more detail about the fund that we use to manage our monthly income and expenses. This fund represents the yearly operating expenses and is called the General Operating Fund or GOF....how clever.

Every penny of the money owned by the First Church is allocated to one fund or another. With the exception of the GOF, the balance in all funds rolls over from year to year. The GOF, however, starts the year with zero dollars and, if all of the boards and committees stick to their budgets and our steeple doesn't fall down, we should end the year at zero dollars. In other words, the amount of pledges, donations, fund raising and such should equal the total expenses for the year. If they don't...well, more about that at the end.

The chart above shows the budgeted expenses for 2017. In order for us to support the operations at First Church (salaries, building costs, etc.) we need to raise almost \$175,000 every year. Most of our expenses are fixed, like electricity, heat, etc. So if we come up short, the only place left to cut is salaries and, as we are searching for a new pastor, this is not what we want to do.

I said that there would be more about the GOF and the end of the year. The goal is to either hit the budget, as we have done the last 2 years, or to come in under budget, which is something I have never seen in the 10 years I've belonged to First Church. Well, this year it looks like we might end the year several thousand dollars under budget. This truly qualifies as a miracle! And come February, at the annual meeting, we have to decide what to do with the excess. We can roll it over, or stash it away for future years, or a little to both. There will be more about this come January. In the meantime, please enjoy this wonderful season with all your heart and soul!!
