Membership Has Its Responsibilities and Its Privileges

Church membership is a covenant between one person, the entire congregation, and God. Sounds important and indeed it is. That is why at First Church Monson, members are called *Covenant Members*. On the religious landscape we are one of the few flavors of Christianity



that places all our governance in the hands of the congregation, under the guidance of the Holy Spirit. For those who have grown up with this form of church government, it's not a big deal. But, if you didn't, the idea of being in total control is not even on your radar. In a conversation with a guest following a memorial service at a church I was serving, it was clear to me that this individual had never encountered a democratic expression of the faith. I turned to our moderator, who had also attended the service, and asked him, "Hey, David, can you fire me with a two thirds majority vote of the congregation?" "Absolutely!" He cheerfully replied.

Church members are given the privilege of voice and vote in all affairs of the church. While we are a "public church," welcoming any and all to Sunday worship, offering a place where all children are invited into our church school, and everyone may participate in the ministries of church, only those who covenant with the congregation and with God as covenant members, may govern the church.

If you look at our bylaws, you will find under Article IV, Section A, the following as the Covenant of the First Church of Monson, Incorporated, (that) shall be accepted as the basis for covenant membership:

We believe in one God, Almighty; in the ideals and principles taught and lived by Jesus the Christ; in the Divine Spirit within every person.

We seek to know and do the will of God; to proclaim, by word and deed, the truth to all humanity.

We strive to work and pray for the progress of knowledge, the promotion of justice, the reign of peace and the realization of the human family.

We look with faith for the triumph of good over evil and for a life everlasting.

I suggest that the season of Lent is an excellent opportunity to reflect on this covenant as covenant members of First Church of Monson. I encourage you to give some thought and prayer to how it is we exercise our privilege and fulfill our responsibilities as we walk together with God.
