There will be fresh fruit and yogurt too! A free will donation is welcomed.



As a service project for this fall, Hearts Willing will be assembling Church World Service (CWS) Period Packs at our November meeting. "Many of our neighbors live in period poverty – lacking access to necessary feminine care supplies. During the menstrual cycle, these hygiene materials are especially important to healthy practices. Not having supplies like sanitary napkins, tampons, wipes, and disposable plastic bags can create challenges that lead to unsafe and unsanitary conditions. The CWS Period Pack gives women and girls the essentials they need to feel clean, be healthy, and live with dignity during the menstrual cycle." CWS Period Packs are a new addition to CWS relief supplies; they are distributed both nationally and globally as needs arise.

Hearts Willing is accepting donations of the following items:

- Tampons, unscented, regular absorbency
- Tampons, unscented, super absorbency
- Sanitary napkins, unscented, long super ultra-thin
- Wet Ones, travel pack
- Flushable wipes, unscented, 42 count package

Collection boxes are located in the narthex and Fellowship Hall. Completed packs will be brought to the Feeding hills Congregational Church for shipment to the Church World Service distribution site. We appreciate your generosity in helping us with this service project!

**World Communion Sunday** is held on the first Sunday of October. For more than eight decades, since 1936, it has served as a reminder that Christians around the globe share same meal in remembrance of Jesus.



During the month of August, Kiel Krommer presented the music of French composers as a prelude and/or postlude each Sunday. Featured composers were Langlais, Gounod, Guilmant, Faure and Vierne. The congregations enjoyed

this special music, especially the Carillon De Westminster by Louis Vierne (1870-1937) which Kiel played as a postlude on the last Sunday in August.

The Music Committee would like to thank everyone for supporting the raffle in memory of Priscilla Martin. Priscilla was a longtime supporter of the First Church music program as a soloist and as founder of the Music Committee. Tickets were sold at the Taizé service in April and the Wings of Song concert in May. A total of \$500 was added to the Eva Farr Fund and will be used to support maintenance needs for the historic Johnson & Son Organ, Opus 781, 1892.

On September 27, 2024, the Reed Historical Organ Society's Estey Fest will be coming to First Church to enjoy the sounds of our organ. Kiel will give a demonstration and Bill Czelusniak will take the group on a tour of the "pipes" and give a historical presentation to enlighten the guests. The Music Committee will be serving a luncheon at noon to at least 100 people. Help is needed for preparation, serving, and clean up. According to Bill Czelusniak of Czelusniak et Dugal, Inc., our organ is in need of maintenance in addition to being tuned on a regular basis. Specifically, the pipes of the Swell Division need a thorough cleaning. There is significant dust and dirt which permeated the pipes due to the work which was done in the sanctuary after the tornado and after the initial cleaning of the pipes. The organ is clean with the exception of 12 ranks of flue pipes, i.e. two stopped wood ranks and III Cornet mixture stop as well as the surrounding and supporting wood work. This will involve evacuating and then replacing the pipes to the "tune" of \$48,000. The Music Committee will submit an application to the Community Preservation Committee asking for a grant to assist in this work. That committee has thanked us for being faithful stewards of our organ, a historic resource of the Monson community.



We know you love to sing, so we are inviting you to join our adult choir. Add your voice to the angels who lead our hymns, sing our anthems and introits, and embrace the power of music in worship. Choir rehearsals are Thursday evenings from 6:30 until 8 p.m. in the Julia Sprague Chapel upstairs under the direction of Kiel

Krommer, Director of Music Ministries at First Church. We hope you will take this opportunity to use your talent to enrich our worship through song. There is no need to audition or sign up, just come.

Carolyn donated the biscuit mix; she, Judy, and Linda made delicious biscuits for the event. Mike and Elaine bought the strawberry mixture, paying for half of it.

On July 4, Summerfest was back on Main Street. Our booth in front of Adams was in a great location, but the crowds were thin, perhaps due to the quality of the vendors. We had a steady stream of customers but not as many as we had hoped.

On the morning of the 4<sup>th</sup>, Chris and Kevin helped Doug & Suzanne set up the booth. Roseann & Nick, Janice, Mary, Joseph, Sarah, Carolyn, and Trish & her granddaughters made and sold strawberry shortcake throughout the day. Suzanne & Doug took everything back to the church at the end of the day and washed coolers, bins, etc.; leftovers were repackaged. On Sunday, Suzanne sold biscuits, berries, and whipped cream after church.

David spearheaded the parking of cars in our lot prior to the parade on the 4<sup>th</sup>. Working with Nashim, Joseph, Chris, and Jean, he raised over \$700 in two hours!

The fireworks were rained out on June 22 and 23, but they were held on July 13 under cooperative skies. Due to a prior commitment, Doug & Suzanne were not able to set up the booth, but they organized everything in Fellowship Hall for Roseann & Nick and Gary to take up to Quarry Hill School. Gary provided the generator, courtesy of Dave Ervin. David, Joseph, Laurie, Linda, and Matthew sold popcorn as fast as they could make it and sold out every beverage. Gary brought everything back to the church after the fireworks. Doug & Suzanne picked up everything on Monday to clean and store for next year. Profit was \$526, the most a fireworks booth has ever made.
