What exactly is Financial Stewardship?

First Church of Monson is part of the United Church of Christ (UCC). The UCC is composed of several Protestant denominations, one of which is Congregational. Our church is self-sustaining, meaning that we receive no monetary funding from other sources within the UCC. Our budget is supported by our members and friends. We generate some funds in the form of interest from trust funds and investments, fundraising efforts, and cell tower rental space, but a significant amount of the funds needed to maintain the building, provide programs and missions, and pay salaries comes directly from voluntary gifts from members and friends. We call these gifts pledges and donations.

The budget for 2025 must be voted on at the Annual Meeting of covenant members in February. To get there, the Stewardship Committee works with all boards and committees and the treasurer to develop a balanced budget in 2024 that can be presented at that meeting. The most important part of this is pledging. Knowing the total pledges and donation amounts, the committee can then see what funds will be promised for the coming year and budget accordingly.

We strongly encourage all members and friends to prayerfully and carefully make a pledge for the coming year. In mid-October, all members and friends received a letter and pledge card in the mail. Additional letters and pledge cards will be available in the Narthex and in the Fellowship Room. Please bring your completed pledge cards to church on November 10, 2024, Stewardship Sunday. Pledge cards may also be mailed to the church office at 5 High St., Monson, MA. Thank you to all who have pledged generously in the past. If you have any questions about Stewardship or pledging, please see a member of the Stewardship Committee.

Loaves and Fishes Coordinators Give Thanks

As we enter the season of Thanksgiving, we would like to thank the members and friends of First Church who prepare meals to be shared through Springfield's Open Pantry Community Services Loaves and Fishes program. The only requirement to have a place at the table is the desire to eat a good meal. No one is turned away.

You can be involved in the Loaves and Fishes program by preparing a main dish casserole or three pounds of cooked carrots. If you opt to make a casserole, we will give you a casserole pan and a recipe. You buy the ingredients and bring the finished casserole to First Church the Sunday before our serving date. To accommodate busy schedules, you can make the casserole or carrots ahead of time and put the item in the church freezer. Just let the coordinators know that the items are in the freezer so we can get them defrosted in time for bringing down to South Congregational Church.

You can also be involved by going to South Congregational Church and helping to serve the meal. We usually travel together from First Church, but servers sometimes meet us at South Congregational at 4 p.m. because that works best in their schedules.

Not having supplies like sanitary napkins, tampons, wipes, and disposable plastic bags can create challenges that lead to unsafe and unsanitary conditions. The CWS Period Pack gives women and girls the essentials they need to feel clean, be healthy, and live with dignity during the menstrual cycle."

Thank you all for your donations of sanitary supplies; at this time, we have plenty. We could still use travel packs of Wet Ones and 42-count packs of unscented flushable wipes. Collection boxes are located in the narthex and Fellowship Hall. We are thankful for your ongoing generosity!



At October meeting of Hearts Willing, Sister Dorothy of the Sisters of Saint Joseph described the plight of the Winnebago Native Americans living in Northeast Nebraska. Years ago, the Winnebagos were forced to leave their ancestral land through a series of wars and treaties. The tribe was moved to this remote location where the soil is poor. Most members of the tribe live in poverty and crowded living conditions

We were able to provide Sister Dorothy with a tote full of crocheted hats, wraps, and booties made with love and care by Elaine and Charlotte. Deb blessed our gifts of warmth as they left First Church to start their journey to Nebraska (before winter arrives).

Sister Dorothy and Maureen marveled at our beautiful sanctuary and impressive organ. They were pleased to see our mission collections for Church World Service Clean-up Buckets and Period Packs. I wouldn't be a bit surprised to see them back at First Church sometime in the future.

After Hurricane Helene devastated Florida, Georgia and North Carolina, Hurricane Milton battered the west coast of Florida, "Church World Service (CWS) has been on the ground responding to both disasters, providing critical supplies to the hardest-hit areas.
